The U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) represents America's commitment to saving lives and the shared responsibility of all global partners toward achieving an AIDS-free generation.

7.7 million men, women, and children receiving live-saving antiretroviral treatment

As of September 30, 2014, PEPFAR is supporting life-saving antiretroviral treatment for 7.7 million men, women, and children (of which, 4.5 million are receiving direct support and an additional 3.2 million are benefiting from essential technical support to partner countries).

- PEPFAR is now differentiating the type of support provided to beneficiaries, recognizing the greater share of investment made by financial collaboration countries to reach these results. We congratulate countries, including Botswana, Namibia, and the Republic of South Africa, for their expanded leadership in this regard.
- The majority of people that PEPFAR directly supports with antiretroviral treatment are in low-income countries.

5 million orphans and vulnerable children received care and support

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2014, PEPFAR provided care and support for more than 5 million orphans and vulnerable children.

6.5 million voluntary medical male circumcision procedures performed

As of September 30, 2014, PEPFAR has supported more than 6.5 million voluntary medical male circumcision (VMMC) procedures in Eastern and Southern Africa to reduce the risk of HIV transmission.

140,000 new health care workers receiving training

As of September 30, 2014, PEPFAR is supporting training (including pre-service training) for more than 140,000 new health care workers in PEPFAR-supported countries to deliver HIV and other health services.

56.7 million people received HIV testing and counseling

In FY 2014, PEPFAR supported HIV testing and counseling for more than 56.7 million people, providing a critical entry point to prevention, treatment and care.

14.2 million pregnant women received HIV testing and counseling

In FY 2014, PEPFAR supported HIV testing and counseling for more than 14.2 million pregnant women.

- For 749,313 of the women who tested positive for HIV
- PEPFAR provided antiretroviral medications to prevent mother-to-child transmission (PMTCT) of the virus. Due to PEPFAR support, 95 percent of these babies were born HIV-free (including 240,000 that would otherwise have been infected).
- Over the past two years, over 1.5 million HIV-positive pregnant women received prevention and treatment services to prevent mother-to-child transmission and improve maternal health.
